
History On The Move are qualified teachers who aim to bring alive what our ancestors in Tudor Times would have eaten at Christmas.



Surrey Monumental Inscriptions Browse on FindMyPast

Boolean Basics by Dick Eastman

Dick Eastman blogs most days and whilst most of his articles relate to US genealogy, many have a wider relevance. You can subscribe to receive his blog at <http://app.feedblitz.com/f/f.fbz?Sub=948986>

In a recent blog Dick Eastman gave an introduction to Boolean search terms. These help focus internet searches so you can avoid receiving large numbers of unhelpful results.

For example he performed a search on Google for:

Washington Harvey Eastman

And got over 40,000 hits!

Dick says: 'The principle search terms are AND, OR, NOT (or -) and Parentheses () .

AND: The first search term is AND (*use Upper Case/Capital letters for all search terms*). The Boolean term AND specifies that the words before and after the term AND must appear somewhere on the page. So three words in this example: Washington **AND** Harvey **AND** Eastman

nb Actually, Google always assumes AND unless you specify otherwise. This may not be true of all other search engines, however.

OR: While not as useful in my simple search, the Boolean term OR indicates that either word or text string will be found. The OR command is very powerful for use in genealogy where name spelling variations are common. The OR command states that you are looking for multiple spellings or names. For instance:

Eastman **OR** Eastmen **OR** Easman

The above search states that any of the three spellings are acceptable.

NOT (or a Dash like -): A much more useful search tool is the use of a NOT command, meaning the following word should NOT appear in the search results. Google uses a dash, or minus sign, to specify NOT. For instance, any search for a person named Eastman will probably find references to a large photography company in Rochester, New York. Those pages can be easily filtered out by using the NOT command:

The following search will significantly reduce the “false hits” that lead to pages concerning photography:

Washington Harvey Eastman **-Kodak**

Notice that the dash precedes the search term with no space between the dash and the next word, that is **-Kodak**

You can also chain together several minus sign commands on the search line. For instance, to reduce the number of pages found about photography while also reducing the number of pages found that refer to Washington, I normally use this search:

Washington Harvey Eastman **-Kodak -George -DC**

This search states that neither the word “Kodak” nor the letters “DC” should appear on any page listed in the search results. I also do not want the word “George” to appear in the results as George Eastman was the founder of Kodak and his name appears often in pages I do not need to see. The **NOT** command and most other Boolean search terms are very powerful, partly because they are literal: they will do exactly what you stated, even if it is not what you intended.

The answer is easy, however: perform multiple searches, both with and without the NOT command.

PARENTHESES (Curved Brackets) can be used to build complex searches that will quickly find pages of interest. For instance, I might know that my ancestor lived in two different towns and I want to find references to him in either place. I might construct the following search:

(Eastman AND Corinth AND Maine) OR (Eastman AND Bangor AND Maine)

This example will search for any references to the name Eastman in either Bangor or in nearby Corinth, Maine. It will ignore any references to Corinth, Mississippi, or to Bangor in Gwynedd, a county in north-west Wales. Google will begin by searching

for all matches that are specified inside the first set of parentheses, and then it will search for all matches that are specified inside the second set of parentheses. It displays all the results at once.'

Give these a go! Let me know if you have any other useful searching tips!

News

Images of Irish civil registration records of births, marriages and deaths have been made available online free of charge at www.irishgenealogy.ie/en. They cover Births from 1864-1915; Marriages from 1882-1940 and Deaths from 1891-1965.

The **Guild of One-Name Studies** and FamilySearch announced that the Guild's collections will now be searchable at FamilySearch.org. The partnership gives guild members another source for preserving their work whilst also allowing more researchers across the globe to benefit from exploring the variant spellings of their personal surnames and possibly connect with others throughout the world who have the same last name.

The **Monumental Archive Project** is a place to access cemetery records, collaborate on research, and discuss approaches to monuments for history, archaeology and genealogy. It is an open community, creating an open database, <http://monumentalarchiveproject.com>.

Project to preserve historical place names. Volunteers are invited to join an online project to preserve Britain's historical place names. The **GB1900** project aims to create a list of up to three million place names on Ordnance Survey county maps dating from 1888-1913. These maps show every town, village, farm, hill and wood in Scotland and the rest of Britain, but there are no detailed listings of historical place names. When completed, the project will provide the world's largest ever historical gazetteer — a valuable free resource for local and family historians in particular. As well as adding a place name, volunteers can contribute any personal memories they have of the place. The National Library of Scotland is a partner in the project, along with the National Library of Wales and the University of Portsmouth.

The Irish Famine Eviction Project – is underway to document evidence of evictions during the Great Irish Famine. It's being co-ordinated by Dr Ciaran Reilly, author of several books on this period of history, who has created a dedicated website to pin-point the famine eviction sites and to record information and background stories about the people displaced and involved in the evictions. More than 400 sites have already been identified and their locations fixed on a map, which can be viewed at <https://irishfamineeviction.com/eviction-map>. The Project is now reaching out to researchers to ask them to submit any information of evictions, locations and local folklore. This could be additional information relating to an eviction already identified, or details of a new, as-yet-unidentified eviction. Details of how to submit information can be found on the site.

ScotlandsPeople launches its new look website. As part of the most extensive upgrade to the service since 2010, **users will be able to search statutory record indexes including birth, death and marriage certificates for free for the first time**. Users will now only be charged if they wish to view or download a record image. The new site also features an improved web design which allows customers to access ScotlandsPeople across digital devices, and an enhanced search function which allows them to locate and view records with greater ease
